WOMEN'S HEARTH

A one of a kind downtown day center for women providing community, activities, classes, social service referrals and housing search case management in a compassionate and supportive environment seven days a week. Participants also have access to phones, computers, internet, healthy food, hygiene supplies, free showers and a respite room.

IN 2018:

- 1,331 women served
- 16,831 visits completed
- 58 women obtained housing
- 2 women obtained employment



MIRYAM'S HOUSE

Transitional housing in a community setting for 9 homeless women without children. Includes one-on-one case management, on-site counseling, life-skills education, and continuing support for residents through an Alumnae Program.

IN 2018:

- 28 women served
- 44 active alumnae
- 10 women obtained employment
- 9 women obtained housing



NEW LEAF BAKERY CAFE

Job training in the food services industry for women with barriers to employment. Hands-on training is offered in a fast-paced commercial kitchen providing catering services, with separate barista training at our full service cafe. Agency-wide job readiness support is also provided.

IN 2018:

- 50 women received job training
- 38 alumnae were connected with services
- 22 women obtained employment
- 9 women advanced their education



EDUCARE

Licensed, sliding-fee scale childcare on the TLC campus for toddlers, preschool and school-age children designed to meet the needs of formerly homeless children. Provides nurturing environment to help children recovering from trauma.

IN 2018:

- 21 children received supportive care
- 2,057 meals were served
- 6,364 hours provided for childcare

IN 2018...

1,524 women and children served by Transitions with **92** permanently housed, **46** became employed & **14** furthered their education.



TRANSITIONAL LIVING CENTER

Transitional housing with support services for women and children experiencing homelessness in 15 apartments and one permanent housing unit on a park-like campus. This program includes on-site counseling, support groups and parenting education classes.

IN 2018:

- 35 families with 79 children served
- 16 families obtained housing
- 12 moms obtained employment
- 1 mom advanced their education

Included: HFAP and Aston-Bleck program results



HOME YARD COTTAGES

Affordable, permanent supportive housing units for families and individuals in 24 cottages. Fifteen of the cottages are net-zero with solar panels. Services include case management and community activities.

IN 2018:

- Opened September 2018
- 24 households enrolled
- 31 adults and 27 children served
- 2 adults advanced their education
