WOMEN'S HEARTH

A one of a kind downtown day center for women providing community, activities, social service referrals and classes. Participants also have access to telephones, computers, internet, healthy food, hygiene supplies, free showers and a respite room.

IN 2016:

- 1,411 women served
- 15,206 visits completed
- 44 women obtained housing
- 4 obtained employment



MIRYAM'S HOUSE

Transitional housing in a community setting for 9 homeless women without children plus one permanent housing apartment for a woman ready to live independently. Includes on-site counseling, life-skills and continuing support for alumnae.

IN 2016:

- 28 women served
- 15 women obtained housing
- 4 women obtained employment
- 2 women advanced their education



EDUCARE

Licensed childcare on the TLC campus for toddlers, preschool and school-age children designed to meet the needs of formerly homeless children.

IN 2016:

- 23 children received supportive care
- 2,530 meals were served



NEW LEAF BAKERY CAFÉ

Provides job training in food services for women with barriers to employment. Hands-on training is offered in a commercial kitchen providing catering services and a café location. Job readiness support includes resume writing and skill development.

IN 2016:

- 44 women received job training
- 20 women obtained employment
- 10 women advanced their education
- 123 women accessed one-on-one job-readiness support



TRANSITIONAL LIVING CENTER

Transitional housing with support services for homeless women and their children in 15 apartments and one permanent housing unit on a park-like campus. This program includes on-site counseling, support groups and parenting education classes.

IN 2016:

- 58 families with 39 children served
- 12 families obtained housing
- 10 moms obtained employment
- 1 mom advanced her education
