Transitions provides safety, support and opportunities to learn the skills for success to homeless and low-income women and children in the Spokane community, empowering them to fight for justice both for themselves and others in need. Megan never thought she would be able to move forward due to her felonies and drug history, until she had an opportunity to move into the Transitional Living Center with her son, T.J. "Honestly, I was just looking for a place to live when I came here but it has been much more than that," Megan said, "**it works**, TLC really gives women the opportunity to change their lives."

This is a chance for the Spokane community to come together and learn about the impact they can make when they invest in these life changing services. An investment of \$350 alone provides one year of support and services for a woman at the Women's Hearth.
