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TRANSITIONS' PEOPLE WHO CARE EVENT RAISES OVER \$1 MILLION IN 9 YEARS

Nonprofit Ending Poverty and Homelessness for Women And Children In Spokane Celebrates Impact Through 10th Annual People Who Care Event: October 23, 2012

SPOKANE, WASH--Over the past 9 years, Transitions has impacted over 13,000 low-income and homeless women and children through funds raised at their People Who Care Event. This year on October 23, Transitions and its supporters will celebrate 10 years of impact by inviting the community to invest in the future of low-income and homeless women and children. The celebration takes place at the Red Lion Hotel At the Park. A breakfast and lunch event are offered in order to accommodate any schedule—breakfast starts at 7:30 a.m. and ends promptly at 8:30, while lunch goes from noon-1:00 p.m.

Guests attend at no cost and are offered an opportunity to invest in the future of Transitions' work during the event. The celebration will feature visual and spoken testimonies of how low-income and homeless women in Spokane have changed their lives because of the support received from Transitions' PWC Event. With music, laughter and fun, guests will learn about the impact they've made. For example, 8,000 women have received life skills training through Transition's since 2003. Guests will also be given the opportunity to continue that momentum and to help more Spokane families succeed.

This is an opportunity for the community to learn about issues facing low-income and homeless women and children in our community while being given the opportunity to make a difference in Spokane.
